About the Role

Purpose of the role

The Senior Marine Purchasing Officer plays a critical role in managing purchasing and supply chain activities for the Interislander ferry service. The Senior Marine Purchasing Officer oversees vendor relationships, manages contracts, and implements cost-saving initiatives while maintaining high quality standards. They are responsible for coordinating between marine procurement, inventory management, and warehousing to optimise supply chain processes and minimise costs. This role is essential in ensuring the Interislander ferry service has the necessary resources to operate safely, efficiently, and in compliance with regulatory requirements.

Key Accountabilities

Within the area of responsibility, this role is required to:

- Manage all purchasing activities for Interislander vessels and spare parts. Develop strategic buying plans to optimise cost-efficiency and quality
- Oversee vendor selection processes, manage complex contracts alongside wider KiwiRail procurement team, and manage relationships with key suppliers locally and internationally
- Lead cost-saving initiatives, including strategic sourcing, volume-based negotiations, and long-term contract development
- Ensure AMOS requisitions are actioned efficiently, implementing systems to improve coordination and realise cost savings through consolidation and strategic purchasing
- Issue Purchase Orders (PO), manage AMOS system upkeep for status of requisitions and purchase orders
- Engage with ships and vendors to ensure timely supply and issuance of invoices
- · Manage SAP processing of invoices post good/services supply
- · Monitor and report on requisitions/PO status
- Assist department heads with budgets/reports and reconciliation from a spends and forecast perspective
- Work with purchase and finance systems (AMOS and SAP) for processing requisitions, POs and invoices. Along with the Purchase Officer, manage open PO reporting
- · Monitor vendor performance with Purchase Officer and KiwiRail procurement team
- Attend Master/Chief Engineer meetings/briefings to familiarise them with central purchase functions and activities
- Oversee maintenance of purchasing records in SAP, ensuring compliance with company policies and developing strategies to enhance data management and reporting
- Collaborate with senior management to align purchasing strategies with KiwiRail's overall objectives and long-term fleet management plans

Key challenges

- Balancing long-term strategic purchasing goals with immediate operational needs of the ferry service
- Adapting procurement strategies to rapidly changing market conditions and technological advancements in the marine industry
